

# Mission

The City of Oshkosh seeks to provide a park and recreation system that will meet the needs of our current residents and future

generations, preserve and protect the City's open space, water, historical and natural resources, and provide a park and recreation program that is designed to enhance the City's quality of life.

The Oshkosh Parks Department consists of Oshkosh's various parks and facilities, urban forestry programs, Riverside Cemetery, Menominee Park Zoo, Pollock Community Water Park, Leach Amphitheater, Children's Amusement Center and Oshkosh Senior's Center.

The Parks Department has 14 rentable shelters and six boat launch areas within the City limits. The park system consists of just over 415 acres of park space.




 The Menominee Park tennis courts and pickle ball courts were constructed.

## 2018 Landscape Operations Division Overview

- The Landscape Operations Division is responsible for the maintenance and management of approximately 10,000 street trees and 8,000 trees within the public parks and other public properties. The division is responsible for landscape maintenance and horticultural operations throughout the city including 12 roundabouts, several planted traffic islands, public parking lot plantings, numerous flower beds on City property and landscape enhancements and construction projects.
- The Landscape Operations Division is also responsible for tree removals, new tree installations, stump removals, tree pruning, plant health care, tree/shrub insect and disease treatments, equipment maintenance, snow removal and other projects. Staff manages additional tree planting projects through various grants and neighborhood improvement project funds. A digital tree inventory is maintained on a regular basis in a GIS system. In 2018, the Landscape Operations Division planted 20 Memorial trees, 220 street trees, removed 141 trees, removed 120 stumps and pruned 2,115 trees.

## Menominee Park Zoo, Pollock Community Waterpark, Leach Amphitheater and Children's Amusement Center Attract Over 190,000 Visitors Annually







- These affordable or free, family-friendly experiences add to the community's quality of life.
- Community partners sponsored over \$36,500 in 2018. These funds helped to enhance special event offerings, keep ticket prices affordable or free, and provide funds to make improvements to facilities.
- In 2018, attendance at Pollock Community Waterpark reached 49,084. The attendance represented an 18% growth from 2017.

Fitness and Wellness Prine Stay social. Stay info The Center has become an approved fitness facility with SilverSneakers, Renew Active

(formerly Optum) and Silver and Fit. These Medicare reimbursement programs are dedicated to making it easy for people aged 65 and older stay active! Revenue from accepted Medicare reimbursement programs grew 53% to \$29,593 in 2018.





28,768 of the visits at the Oshkosh Seniors Center were people participating in fitness related activities. This number represents 51% of the Center's total visits in 2018. Renovated spaces, new equipment and additional classes helped to accommodate the growth of older adults committed to staying active!

## **Volunteers**

- The annual volunteer recognition dinner for the Oshkosh Seniors demonstrates the limitless energy of nearly 300 volunteers generously giving over 24,788 hours—a value of \$612,000.

Block Parties and other Special Events have been around since the early 1900's. The first of its kind starting in the streets of New York city when residents roped off the city streets to honor the residents on the block going off to war. Since that time, events have continued to flourish, bringing together families, friends, neighbors, and communities all for a common cause.

The City of Oshkosh recognizes the importance of special events, not only for the purpose of connecting people but creating an identity for the community while benefiting the development of tourism and local business promotion. Whether a business is simply in the vicinity of the event, or is a sponsor of an event, events allow businesses to showcase their products and services to hundreds and thousands of people in attendance.

Events give us a sense of pride, encouraging us to take better care of our community. We want to make the streets and neighborhoods safe places to host events. And while a majority of the events held in the City of Oshkosh are fundraisers for local nonprofit groups, those funds directly benefit the residents and neighborhoods of Oshkosh.

There were 250 events in 2018 that required extraordinary services throughout the city. Of these, 120 qualified as "Special Events" and received a Special Events Permit. From block parties to sporting events, the City of Oshkosh continues to support and promote events in our community.
