MISSION AND VISION STATEMENT

The Ferry Crossing Neighborhood Association (FCNA) represents all the residents living within the below stated boundaries on a **voluntary basis**. These residents are **not** required to join or participate. Our hope is to build up and support the spirit of community within our diverse neighborhood by encouraging and providing opportunities for collaboration, participation and civic involvement.

Mission:

- Inform members of private initiatives and public policies significant to our association.

- Respect, recognize and maintain ethnic, family, and cultural diversity
- Achieve a sense of community and security by encouraging responsibility, involvement and pride among all
 residents and owners
- Support healthy and active relationships with other neighborhood groups, civic organizations and government agencies

Neighborhood Association Boundaries:

- Westside of Vinland St. and to include both sides of Sheridan St.
- North side of Linwood Ave. to natural southern boundary of Glenn Valley Horse Farm

Leadership:

The FCNA is led by a core team of 3, but no more than 5 members, who address specific issues and advise if an additional committee is necessary. The core team is to provide leadership and communication for the betterment of the association. Leadership is on a volunteer basis. A core team member could step down voluntarily at anytime, although a commitment of one year, beginning in October, is appreciated.

Meetings:

FCNA meetings are open to all residents, however, only members of FCNA who are present and 14 yrs of age or older are eligible to vote. Voting may occur by raise of hand, ballots or verbal. Majority vote will decide the outcome and be duly noted in the minutes of that meeting.

Attendance to general meetings, held the second Monday of October, January, April, and July, are encouraged. Other meetings may be called for organizing purposes.

Bylaws may be reevaluated at any given time to adjust to the needs of the FCNA. Changes will be brought forth to members at a general meeting.
