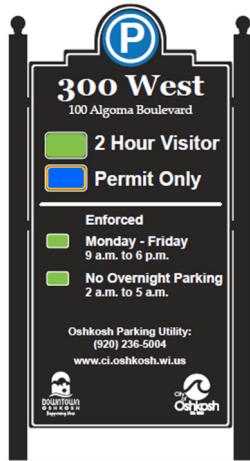




City of Oshkosh Downtown Parking Guide

If what's "happening now" brings you downtown, then we want to help you understand your options for on-street and off-street parking.



Downtown has two primary types of parking: **permit parking** and **free short-term parking**. Permit parking can provide you with a lot of flexibility if you work or visit downtown frequently or spend a long time there. Free parking options work well for customers or visitors who stay for short periods of time.



Permit parking spots are indicated by blue lettered signage. To use one of these spaces, you will need to have a monthly or an annual hang tag.

What types of permits are there and how much do they cost?

Permits are available with daily (\$1.58), monthly (\$31.50) and annual (\$357.00) permit options. All prices include sales tax. Permits are available from the Collections Office at City Hall. Volume discounts are available, please contact the Collections Office for more information. For your convenience, you may pre-pay for several months of monthly hang tags.

How do I use a permit?

Hang tags should be attached to your vehicle according to the instructions provided.

Where is the Permit Parking available?

Most permit spaces are located in public off-street parking lots (see Downtown Parking Lot Map on reverse). The spaces are indicated by signage.

When do I need to use a permit?

Most permit parking spaces are enforced between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. daily except weekends and holidays. Vehicles may generally park in a permit space overnight (between 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m.) with a permit.



Does a permit reserve a particular parking space?

Permits allow you to park in any permit parking space, giving you the flexibility to park at different locations based on what meets your needs and where parking is available.

Free, short-term parking

Spaces are generally available on-street and in many public downtown lots, typically for up to 2 hours.

Who can use these spaces?

These spaces are designed for visitor and customer convenience. These spaces are designed for visitor and customer convenience.



Where is free parking available?

Most on-street parking in the downtown area is free, short-term parking. Longer duration free parking options are available on streets further away from downtown.

Can I park in a free space overnight?

Overnight parking from 2:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m. is prohibited without a permit.

The downtown also offers accessible parking. Anyone can use these spaces with the proper state-issued permit. Please note that some of these spaces have time restrictions.

The downtown also has limited leased or reserved parking. These spaces are assigned to specific people or businesses and are enforced 24 hours per day, seven days per week. Please contact the Collections Office for information on rates and availability.
