## Oshkosh Common Council selects new Oshkosh City Manager

**OSHKOSH, Wis., December 19, 2024** – The Oshkosh Common Council has selected Rebecca Grill as the community's next City Manager. As City Manager, Ms. Grill will act as the chief executive and administrative officer for the city of Oshkosh.

Ms. Grill has been the City Administrator/City Clerk for the city of West Allis, Wisconsin for the last nine years. She has approximately 20 years of municipal leadership experience. She has earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science and a Criminal Justice degree, as well as a Master of Business Administration in Finance, both from Concordia University. Ms. Grill is also a Credentialed Manager - International City/County Management Association (ICMA-CM) and is a University of Wisconsin Madison Certified Public Manager.

"We are thrilled to welcome Rebecca Grill to the city of Oshkosh. We are excited to have someone with her ability to step into this important role," commented Mayor Matt Mugerauer. "Rebecca's extensive background in local government, community engagement and strategic leadership abilities make her an exemplary choice to navigate the opportunities we face. Ms. Grill is enthused to become Oshkosh's next City Manager. Ms. Grill is expected to begin her new position with the city of Oshkosh on February 24th, 2025, after formal approval at the Common Council's special meeting on Monday, December 23rd at Noon. She replaces Mark Rohloff who is retiring on January 3, 2025, after 16 years of service to the city.
